Top Ten in the Nation - 6 years in a row

Site Selection magazine has named the Greensboro - High Point MSA as one of the nation's Top 10 regions for business growth and economic development success. The Greensboro-High Point MSA includes Randolph and Rockingham Counties along with Guilford.

This is the 6th year in a row that the region has been recognized for business attraction of investments of at least \$1 million or more. The region was named sixth in the nation for metros from 200,000 to 1,000,000 in population for results in 2012. Four economic development partners including Greensboro, High Point, Randolph and Rockingham Counties shared in the announcement in the magazine's March publication.

Megasite Grant awarded to Randolph County

Randolph County received a \$1.67 million grant from the NC Department of Commerce to be used for the planning, evaluation and control of a potential megasite in northeastern Randolph County. A megasite is defined as a location suitable for a major industrial user that would generate significant job creation and economic activity with regional impact. North Carolina has identified megasites as a strategic goal and the grant was made recognizing that communities and the state must prepare in advance of a prospective user.

Randolph County and the Triad offer numerous advantages for a major industrial operation that include a central location, outstanding transportation infrastructure, a manufacturing heritage and most importantly, a workforce that is experienced in manufacturing and eager to work. The Triad region lost 90,000 jobs from 2000-2010, more than the rest of the state combined. In Randolph County, unemployment stands at 11.1%, meaning that 8,221 of our residents seeking new job opportunities.

Economic impact analysis shows that more than 6,800 new regional jobs would be generated by a mega project in our area. That would be welcome news to the unemployed and underemployed members of our community. This is not an overnight project but the planning and action are underway. Economic development is a process that requires partners, long term thinking, and solid planning. A megasite is one component of a local, regional and state plan to create jobs and stimulate the economy. Programs supporting existing industries, product development, marketing & targeted industrial growth are just as important.

Business Announcements

Discount Box & Pallet Company has purchased the Brower building in Staley for business expansion. The building is 106,010 square feet on 21.6 acres and formerly housed a wood pallet company. Owner Jeff Coble plans an expansion to the Staley facility to accommodate business growth.

Sealy was officially acquired by Tempur-Pedic on March 18; the deal combines two iconic bedding brands into the world's largest bedding company. Sealy will continue to operate at its Archdale campus with manufacturing and divisional office functions. Sealy first located in Archdale in 1999 and today employs around 350 in the plant and office. The combined company will continue to produce under the Sealy name as well as Tempur-Pedic.

Novamelt Americas received approval for economic incentives by the City of Trinity on March 19. Randolph County will hold a public hearing on April 8 for the project. If approved by the county and state, the project would result in 11 new high quality jobs over 5 years and \$4 million in new investment in real and personal property. Novamelt produces adhesives used in self adhesive medical, packaging, food and industrial applications. The company begin operation in Trinity in 2006 in their first US facility and currently operate on three continents.

Trinity Furniture plans to add 24,000 square feet to its existing facility to consolidate all operations at one location. The project will add 5 new jobs, in addition to the 85 current workers. The expansion is possible in part because of sewer extension that occurred in 2009 as part of an economic development project.

GFS -US will locate their expanded operation in Archdale on Uwharrie Road. GFS plans to produce a bio-manufactured product that will be used in the fracking process for natural gas. The product is used to reduce the toxic chemicals used in the process. The company has purchased a 15,000 square foot facility and plans to add up to 6 jobs by the end of 2013. The company is headquartered at the Piedmont Triad Research Park in Winston Salem.
