## **EDC Annual Meeting Highlights Apprenticeship Randolph**

On June 19, the EDC hosted its 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Meeting at AVS Banquet Centre in Asheboro. The theme of this year's meeting was <u>Apprenticeship Randolph</u>, a new program which pairs high school students with local manufacturers seeking to grow their own workforce in this time of worker shortages and low unemployment rates. The keynote speaker of the morning was Chris Harrington, director of operations at Asheboro-based Elastic Therapy, Inc. Harrington shared an overview of the apprenticeship program and offered insight about the value of the program from the perspective of an Apprenticeship Randolph partner employer. He concluded his presentation by recognizing partner companies and organizations whose collaboration resulted in a successful inaugural year. A digital copy of Harrington's slide deck is



available by contacting the EDC. Following the keynote address, Jonathan Mroczkowski, a current student apprentice at Jaeco Precision, shared some brief thoughts about the opportunities being afforded to him through Apprenticeship Randolph.

Each year, the EDC confers the Partner in Progress award to an individual or organization that promotes and supports the work of economic development in Randolph County. In keeping with the program theme, this year's award recipient was Nancy Cross, Director of Career Technical Education for Randolph County Schools. Cross took the urging of a local business leader to heart and worked tirelessly to coordinate the creation of a youth apprenticeship program in Randolph County. She was recognized for her leadership, dedication, vision, collaboration, organization, and determination to take Apprenticeship Randolph from idea to reality. The award was presented by EDC Board Chairman Elbert Lassiter.



## Randleman Chamber Recognizes Local Businesses

On May 22<sup>nd</sup>, at its 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary Annual Meeting, the Randleman Chamber of Commerce recognized several Randleman-area businesses, including four manufacturers. **Hughes Furniture Industries** received the John Banner Randleman Award, recognizing the qualities exemplified by the city's founding father. Hughes Furniture manufactures upholstered residential furniture out of facilities in Randleman and Asheboro. **Rheem's** replacements parts distribution facility was honored as Randleman's Industry of the Year. The Chamber also recognized **Commonwealth Hosiery Mills** and **United Brass Works** with the Centennial Plus award, given in honor of their community leadership and success in sustaining their businesses through the decades despite challenges such as economic downturns.

A May 21 <u>article</u> in the Triad Business Journal reported that Archdale-based **Fixxus Industrial Holdings** is growing and expecting to double its current workforce of 42 in a year's time. The growth is coming on the heels of new financial backing, a result of the Warren Equity Partners acquisition of Fixxus parent company Superior Industrial Maintenance Company. Formerly known as Crossway Coatings, Fixxus is a specialty coatings contractor which applies USDA-approved coatings in food-grade facilities. Asheboro-based **PEMMCO Manufacturing** was one of thirty-three companies recognized at the recent Honda Power Equipment Supplier Conference which was held in Greensboro. According to a Honda <u>press release</u>, the Swepsonville, NC Honda Power Equipment facility was serviced by 170 OEM suppliers in 2017. Suppliers were recognized for outstanding achievement in the areas of quality and delivery. PEMMCO was one of thirteen companies to receive an Excellence in Delivery award recognizing the strong track record of on-time deliveries. PEMMCO is a precision CNC machining facility offering CNC milling, CNC turning, and

On June 1, **StarPet** in Asheboro celebrated fifteen years of collaboration with its parent company, Thailand-based Indorama Ventures. The event, which was <u>covered</u> by the Courier-Tribune, featured speeches by corporate leadership who touted the quality personnel at StarPet as those who are responsible for the company's competitive advantage. The celebration concluded with the company's annual safety and attendance award ceremony. StarPet manufactures polyethylene terephthalate (PET), a polymer which is used to manufacture products such as water bottles, juice containers, and other similar items. <u>www.indoramaventures.com</u>

The Dart Foundation made two recent grant awards in Randolph County according to articles in the Courier-Tribune. Although separate from **Dart Container Corporation** which operates a production facility in Randleman, both organizations were founded by William Dart and eligibility for Dart Foundation grants requires proximity to a Dart production operation. The Randolph Community College Foundation was <u>awarded</u> \$100,395 for purchase of a coordinated measuring machine and a certification cart, items which will serve the advanced manufacturing programs at RCC. In addition to RCC, the Randolph County School System received a grant <u>award</u> of \$49,765 which will fund the purchase of Chromebooks for four schools. Ernie Green Industries has announced a potential investment at its Seagrove facility which could lead to the creation of 12 new jobs. Made public at the June meeting of the Randolph County Board of Commissioners, the proposed project to install additional clean room space would result in investment of approximately \$240,000. EGI has solicited grant assistance from the state for the project and initial review is pending at the state level. In June, Asheboro-based **Klaussner Home Furnishings** announced a new outdoor furniture line in a successful ongoing collaboration with artist William Mangum. The collection is named Urban Retreat and is part of Mangum's Carolina Preserves collection, according to an <u>article</u> in Furniture Today. A July 7 article in the Courier-Tribune <u>reports</u> that **Oliver Rubber's** Asheboro plant has been recognized with a Safety and Health and Improvement Program (SHIP) award by the U.S. Tire Manufacturers Association. A wholly owned subsidiary of Michelin North America, Oliver Rubber was one of four U.S. Michelin plants to receive the SHIP award. Classified as a USTMA Excellence Award, the SHIP award "is presented to facilities that receive a 'Days Away Restricted and Transfers' (DART) rate that is 75 percent better than the average achieved by other USTMA plants." Plant manager Steve Scruggs credited the recognition to the hard work and dedication of the Oliver Rubber employees.

The EDC announced a new slate of officers and welcomed new Board members at June's Annual Meeting. The new slate of officers for the 2018-19 year is Chairman Clyde Phillips with James River Equipment, Vice Chairman Billy Hardin with UNITS Storage, Past Chairman Elbert Lassiter with RCC, and Secretary/Treasurer Dave Craven with Fidelity Bank. Four Board members were acknowledged for their service as their terms ended: John Grey, Chris Lackey, Nelson Smith, and Eric Ward. New Board members Bob Crumley with Crumley Commercial, Carlos Dias with Technimark, Todd Schwarz with Schwarz Properties, and Donald Simmons with Magnolia 23 restaurant.

On May 23, Sprouse participated in a legislative day in Raleigh hosted by the North Carolina Economic Development Association (NCEDA), a professional orginzation dedicated to improving the business climate in North Carolina in order to better position the state for expansion and corporate location decisions. The participants met with local lawmakers to promote the organization's <u>legislative priorities</u>.

At the end of May, Sprouse and several other economic development partners spent three days in Chicago meeting with site selection consultants to promote Randolph County and the Greensboro-Randolph Megasite. Over the next couple of months, Sprouse has additional marketing trips planned to Michigan, Atlanta, and Philadelphia.

Sprouse, Franklin, and EDC marketing manager Lisa Bennett participated in the NCEDA's annual professional development conference at Wrightsville Beach in mid-June. Sessions included updates from NC Commerce, NCDOT, and the EDPNC; helpful tips on marketing; panel discussions on transportation and Opportunity Zones; and an introduction to foreign trade and investment directors representing North Carolina in Japan, China, and South Korea.

On July 11, Franklin coordinated industry visits in Trinity to introduce business leaders to congressional field representatives from the offices of Congressman Walker and Senators Burr and Tillis. Trinity Mayor Jesse Hill and city manager Debbie Hinson also participated. The team visited Elite Displays & Design, Ennis-Flint, Jowat, Trinity Furniture, and Verellen Furniture.

Sprouse attended the <u>Energizing Rural NC</u> conference in Pinehurst on July 12-13. Sponsored by the EDPNC, the event was an effort to raise awareness and inspire actionable strategies for rural economic development, with a special focus on the building blocks of infrastructure, workforce, education, health, and leadership.
