## **EDC Kicks Off Randolph Industrial Council**

On Thursday, November 14, the EDC hosted an inaugural meeting of the Randolph Industrial Council. The event was well attended, with 40 representatives from 22 different industries from across the county participating. Inspired by internal EDC conversations and spurred by a specific industry request, the Randolph Industrial Council is an effort to bring together diverse manufacturers from all corners of the county to get acquainted, share ideas, learn from one another, and seek opportunities to do business with each other. Nufabrx was the keynote speaker for the November event, with a presentation focused on technology and innovation in the textile industry, some of which is taking place right here in Randolph County.

The EDC plans to host quarterly meetings of the Council touching on topics relevant to manufacturing. A volunteer steering committee comprised of industrial representatives will help drive content. In addition to quarterly meetings, we plan to host additional events to further engage our manufacturing base.

The EDC is committed to supporting our county's manufacturing base, and the Randolph Industrial Council is part of that effort. Collaboration and the free flow of ideas generated through the Council will serve to enhance the manufacturing environment in Randolph County.

Asheboro-based Founder's Hemp will receive \$150,000 in funding thanks to a Building Reuse Grant awarded to the City of Asheboro to assist with a renovation project. The company will renovate existing warehouse space by constructing five new clean rooms to expand its extraction capacity.

The clean rooms will meet the supplement grade processing standards. Total investment in the project, including machinery and equipment, is anticipated to exceed \$400,000, and the company is committed to creating at least fifteen new jobs with an average annual wage of \$35,667. to LED lighting throughout their 50,000 square foot facility located on Industrial Park Ave. in Asheboro. They also upgraded their outdated HVAC systems to new energy efficient systems, replacing 7 units. "Through the REAP grant, which was learned about from the guidance of Kevin Franklin of RCEDC, we were reimbursed for approximately 25% of the costs of the total project," said Lori Trotter, Business Manager of Trotters Sewing. "Not only did we save money on the project with the grant monies, but we are going to see savings in the company with the energy efficient improvements, as well as help the environment. This was a win-win for our company in so many ways." Trotters Sewing Company is a family-owned contract cut and sew manufacturer which employs approximately 50 people. The EDC now hosts an updated <u>sites and buildings database</u> on our website. A partnership with the Economic Development Partnership of NC powered by GIS Planning, the updated system offers enhanced information and search tools. While primarily focused attraction of new business to available sites and buildings in Randolph County, the tool offers much more analysis including city and county profiles, demographic information, labor force data, and much more.
