COVID-19 Brings Disruption, Opportunities

When we published our January newsletter, we could not have anticipated the disruption that COVID-19 would bring. During this time of uncertainty, the EDC has been focused on communicating with our stakeholders, sharing resources and information, and supporting our local industry. Our stakeholders have expressed appreciation for our efforts and timely communication. The EDC has compiled a number of relevant resources <u>on</u> <u>our website</u> to make it readily available in one location.

When the EDC learned that supplies of PPE were limited at Randolph Health, we put out a call to our local manufacturers and many responded. As a result, the local hospital now has access to masks which are critical for the safety of hospital personnel. "We love making connections between local suppliers and customers," said EDC president Kevin Franklin. "It has been great to see our Randolph County industry answer the call to help meet this need right here in our community."

Governor Cooper's stay at home order has had a disparate impact on local manufacturers depending on their essential business status. Some manufacturers have closed voluntarily out of concern for employees, declining orders, or inability to receive necessary components. Some have closed for the month of April in accordance with the state-wide stay at home order for non-essential businesses and operations. Others are seeing orders increase or they are pivoting to make PPE to meet local, regional, and national demand.

AEC Narrow Fabrics in Asheboro has seen a spike in orders for narrow elastic bands used in face masks and shields needed by medical personnel and potentially sick individuals. According to a <u>March 15 article</u> in the Greensboro News & Record, AEC has been working to fill a 3-million-yard order for a Texas company making millions of masks. *AEC Narrow Fabrics manufactures narrow fabrics for applications including apparel, bedding, medical, and automotive. <u>www.aecnarrowfabrics.com</u>*

Over the past year, **Aeolus Filter Corporation** in Archdale has completed facility renovations and added equipment which has positioned the company to better supply much-needed product for the pandemic. Thanks to the new equipment, Aeolus is better prepared to offer HEPA filters and face mask media, both high demand items. A <u>March 22 article</u> in the Hickory Daily Record highlights production of medical masks with a Randolph County connection. Conover-based Nufabrx has developed an antimicrobial mask to help meet pressing demand, and the production is mostly being

On March 31, <u>Area Development reported</u> that American Leather Holdings is "shifting its manufacturing capabilities to produce masks and gowns for individuals

who are working on the front lines fighting the virus."
